<ul> <li>Access the homophones quiz on the Purple Mash 2do.</li> <li>Use <u>supermovers</u> to help you remember the definition of a homophone.</li> <li>Our spellings for this week are: their they're mane main ordinary group perhaps grammar learn (because, break, prove, any, pretty)</li> <li>Practice these daily using look/cover/check, or writing them in a crossword or using rainbow colours. Remember to check the different meanings.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Practise your handwriting daily. This is the perfect opportunity to send a handwritten letter to a family member or friend. If you have a touchscreen device, you could use 2Handwrite on Purple Mash - exploring different writing implements.</li> <li>Your grammar activity this week is expressing time, place and cause using conjunctions. This is a cloze activity set as a 2do (Bella and the Farm) on Purple Mash.</li> <li>Use the recipe template set as a 2do on Purple Mash to write out your own nutritious recipe. Remember to include imperative (bossy) verbs as sentence openers and organise your recipe using bullet points. As a Computing link, you could try adding a photograph of the finished item.</li> <li>Remind yourself how bullet points are used by doing the following supermovers.</li> </ul>

<ul> <li>Practice the balances that we have been learning this term. You will need a family member to help you with this. You will need to give clear instructions on what to do and be careful!</li> <li>Continue to practice sending and receiving balls of different sizes using your hands and your feet. Rebound balls off walls or another willing participant! Develop your control taking care to adjust the direction and strength of your sending.</li> <li>Join in with Joe Wicks every morning at 9am for a thirty minute P.E. lesson. There are also shorter workouts available on his webpage.</li> <li>Practice your times tables using <u>supermovers</u>.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>On Tuesdays and Thursdays children can create some great pictures with the help of <u>Rob Biddulph</u>, a children's author. The two from last week are already on.</li> <li>Warhol, Rembrandt and Goya are all famous artists who used printing as a technique. Research one of them and create a print in the style of your chosen artist.</li> </ul>
Learning Project Various activities covering the wider curriculum to be completed over the week.	
<ul> <li>Let's Wonder: In Science we have been studying animals, including humans. Use Purple Mash to complete the 2do: muscles.</li> </ul>	
• Let's Create: Follow a recipe to make a nutritious meal or drink (soup, smoothie, cake, pizza etc.). Add an ingredient to put your own twist on it. You will be writing up the recipe as part of English this week.	
• Be Active: Can you design an Easter Egg hunt around your house and garden? Make sure you are using the space available to you in the most active way. Remember to hide clues/eggs at different levels.	
• Time to Talk: Using your recipe as inspiration, find out what ingredients the members of your household would like best. Ask them to test your recipe and give you some feedback.	
• Understanding Others and Appreciating Differences: How do other countries and religions celebrate Easter? If they don't celebrate Easter, do they have a different Spring celebration or one involving chocolate? Create a collage of images from each celebration.	
● Reflect: Watch the video on Purple Mash about the Easter story and write a letter to a friend explaining what happened using the 2do. This will be available from Wednesday.	
Some phonics and handwriting activities have been set as 2dos on Purple Mash for those children who still need to practice these.
