 Daily <u>TTRockstars</u>. Daily <u>numbots</u>. Practise units of measurement with <u>supermovers</u>. Revise measurement (length and perimeter) on <u>White Rose Maths</u>. Find the perimeter of objects around the house: a kitchen cupboard door, the letterbox, a window, a paving slab. You can round to the nearest cm or challenge yourself and measure in mm! Complete the 3 maths 2do activities on <u>Purple Mash</u> linked to converting units of measure and perimeter. Use chalk (can be done on paper, just change the numbers) and draw shapes outside with the following perimeters: 40cm, 1m, 60cm, 3m, 80cm, 2.4m 	 Share books daily and ask and answer questions. Include a variety of fiction, non-fiction and poetry. Listen for free to <u>The Swiss Family Robinson</u>. Write a review of your favourite book of the week on the <u>Purple Mash</u> 2do.  Access the various spelling quiz 2dos on <u>Purple Mash</u> to practise spelling rules learnt so far in Y4. Our spellings for this week are words with the /k/ sound spelt 'ch': <u>scheme</u> <u>chorus</u> <u>chemist</u> <u>echo</u> <u>character</u> <u>ache</u> <u>monarch</u> <u>stomach</u> <u>orchid</u> <u>orchestra</u> Practise these daily using look/say/cover/write/check, or writing them in a crossword or using rainbow colours. Remember to check the different meanings in a dictionary. Access the Campsite Jim 2do on <u>Purple Mash</u> to practise comma placement after fronted adverbials. 	 Go on the 'World Tour' 2do on <u>Purple Mash</u>. Watch the video clip and research and write about a holiday destination for the traveller to visit. Think about your layout. You may want to use commas in a list, bullet points or subheadings to organise your ideas. Use <u>supermovers</u> to revise how to use inverted commas. Choose a country or city in the world as a setting for an adventure story. You need to invent at least two characters and your story should include speech (including inverted commas!). This can be done on paper or the Adventure Story 2do. This is the handwriting scheme we follow at school, through this website you can download worksheets and visual aids to support your child in practicing the correct cursive formation. In Y4 we need to be secure with how to join letters correctly.
