## Week 1: How does your garden grow?



Maths Tasks	Reading Tasks
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Daily numbots.</li><li>• Daily TTRockstars.</li><li>• Play <a href="#">hit the button</a> - focus on number bonds to 10, 20 and 100.</li><li>• Add and subtract 10 from any number up to 150. <a href="#">This video</a> may help, but in Y2 we focus mainly on 2-digit numbers. Once you are confident doing this with objects or drawing, see if you can do it mentally - play it when throwing/catching a ball. Every time you catch the ball you must answer the question given to you.</li><li>• Use coins to find different ways of making the same amount e.g. how many ways can you make 50p? This <a href="#">game</a> could help support.</li><li>• Set up a pretend shop and role play buying and selling goods and giving change.</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Recall the story 'The Tin Forest' which we have been learning about in school. Draw a picture of your favourite part of the story and write a few sentences about that part of the story.</li><li>• Look at the poem '<a href="#">Who has seen the wind?</a>' by Christina Rossetti. Practise reading it out loud and perform the poem to your family.</li><li>• Complete the book review 2do on <a href="#">Purple Mash</a> for a book you enjoyed reading this week. It will be in your 'alerts' bell.</li><li>• Listen to '<a href="#">The Empty Pot</a>' and complete some of the suggested activities in the Teachers' Guide.</li></ul>
Daily Phonics/Spelling Tasks	Writing Tasks
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Learn how to spell the days of the week. Use a spelling scribble, spelling pyramid or dotty writing to help you. Spellings are best learnt daily.</li><li>• Complete the spelling quiz on <a href="#">PurpleMash</a> - Y2 Aut1 WK1 - Quiz</li><li>• Complete the <a href="#">spelling frame</a> games for the /dʒ/ sound (rules 1-3).</li><li>• At the end of the week get an adult to test you on the days of the week spellings.</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Write your own poem based on Christina Rossetti's 'The Wind'. Change it to focus on the element of water. Type it onto the 2publish 2do on <a href="#">Purple Mash</a>.</li><li>• Complete the 'My Plant Diary' 2do on <a href="#">Purple Mash</a>. This could be for the cress seeds we grew in class or some new seeds you have planted.</li><li>• Write 10 sentences with adjectives to describe the plants and trees in your garden e.g. <i>On the tree, the soft pink blossom is peeking out of the tiny bud.</i></li><li>• Complete the 'Little Red Meets the Wolf' activity on <a href="#">Purple Mash</a>. Add capital letters, full stops, ? and ! to the end of sentences.</li><li>• Make your own postcard with a drawing of a plant on the front and send it to someone to cheer them up! Look at how to write an address with capital letters and start a new line for each part of the address.</li></ul>

**Learning Project**

Science - Plant some seeds and care for them as they grow. You could even make a [grass head!](#)

Art - Go into your garden and draw/paint a spring flower or plant which has started to grow. No card to paint on? Use the inside of a cereal box!

D.T. - Talk about the food in your fridge and cupboards. How did they grow? How is it made? What food group are they from? Create an [eatwell plate](#).

Geography - Use a map to find where different food items in your house originally came from. Look at the labels on chocolate, bananas, coffee, raspberries, pasta etc. What do the flags of these countries look like? Which continent are they on?
