What we are learning...

English:

In English, we will be continuing to read *Cosmic* by Frank Cottrell Boyce, and using this text to develop further skills in our writing. This will include writing a biography of a famous astronaut and writing a newspaper report of Liam's, the character from *Cosmic*, journey in space.

Maths:

In maths, we will be continuing our work with fractions. We will be using our current knowledge to add and subtract fractions with different denominators.

We will then be moving onto decimals and percentages later in the term.

Other areas of learning:

This term we will be looking at forces in science. This promises to be a hands on topic, with the children investigating friction, levers, pulleys, gravity, and other forces first hand through a series of experiments.

We will also be investigating our local area in geography, where we will be locating the human and physical characteristics of Church Fenton. We will also be developing our map skills by using eight points of a compass and 6 figure-grid references.
