Remember to check the different meanings.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Practise your handwriting daily. This is the perfect opportunity to send a handwritten letter to a family member or friend. If you have a touchscreen device, you could use 2Handwrite on Purple Mash - exploring different writing implements.• Your grammar activity this week is using the present perfect form of verbs instead of the simple past tense. This is a cloze activity set as a 2do (The dog and the ball) on Purple Mash.• Use the exercise poster template set as a 2do on Purple Mash to create a poster convincing people to exercise more. Remember to include lots of persuasive language.• Remind yourself about commas, brackets and dashes by doing the following supermovers.

Can you throw the ball higher or use a smaller ball? Try to improve on your initial score. • Continue to practice sending and receiving different objects using your hands and your feet. Rebound balls off walls or another willing participant! Introduce a bat or racquet. Develop your control taking care to adjust the direction and strength of your sending. • Join in with Joe Wicks every morning at 9am for a thirty minute P.E. lesson. There are also shorter workouts available on his webpage. • Practice your times tables using supermovers. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • On Tuesdays and Thursdays children can create some great pictures with the help of Rob Biddulph, a children's author. The two from last week are already on. • Think about how you can use dots to create patterns. This can be explored by creating your own indigenous art set as a 2do on Purple Mash or using different coloured and sized chalks, paints or ink (remember to ask for permission first and only use dots).

Make them out of objects that you have to collect from around your house or garden. Which was the trickiest to make? If you would like to send me a photo on 2email, they could be uploaded onto twitter.</p> <p>● Time to Talk: Have you and your family visited other countries or areas in the UK? Which have been their favourites and why? If your family could live anywhere else in the UK, where would it be?</p> <p>● Understanding Others and Appreciating Differences: Can you help Mrs Jones advise someone who is worried about having to wear glasses? Complete the 2do on Purple Mash.</p> <p>● Reflect: Our theme for this term is forgiveness.
