

Throughout the year we focus on a different Christian value which we encourage the children to display in their learning and play



We celebrate these in our classroom worship area and throughout the week we join together as a class or a whole school community to take part in worship.



Uniform

- A red sweatshirt, jumper or cardigan, perhaps with the school badge
- A white/red polo shirt
- Grey shorts, trousers, skirt or dress
- Black school shoes
- White t-shirt, red shorts and pumps
- A book bag and drawstring PE bag
- Warm, serviceable school coat





Label EVERYTHING!

- No matter how hard we try, when children get changed for PE they will put each others clothes on!
- Hats, scarves, gloves, t-shirts, socks, shoes...
- Sewing labels is probably the most effective technique, otherwise permanent markers are also good.

A named book bag and PE bag also help keep all your child's belongings together, and is easy to identify should it go missing!





Lunch Time

- A FREE cooked school meal (or packed lunch)
- Eaten in the school hall
- Lunch is a social time. We expect children to have good manners, to be able to sit around a table talking quietly to each other and to be able to use a knife and fork.
- Play time is in the main playground, which has a small area for EYFS children should they want an

area which is quieter

Lunch time ends at 1.00pm



What Can You Do To Support Your Child To Be An Effective Learner

- Help them to be independent zipping coats, putting on shoes, accessing their own toys at home and putting them away again
- Using a knife and fork to eat independently
- Respect toys and equipment
- Help your child to make choices for themselves
- Talk and listen, encouraging talk
- Praise their efforts the process, not necessarily the product
- Give them time to play imaginatively, developing concentration
- Play games which involve taking turns and sharing
- Provide a wide range of active experiences
- Read stories together
- Have fun together!
