Meaning: to do something bravely and with great courage.

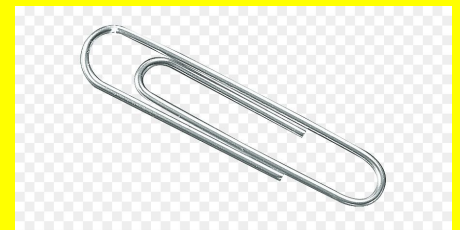
Despite his fear, the boy valiantly edged towards the mysterious noise.

Geography: Comparing a region of North America to a region in the UK.

As we found out before Easter, North America is a very diverse continent with a wide variety of human (man made) and physical (natural) geography. Today, you need to investigate an area of North America and compare it with our local area of Leeds or York.

First, you need to go through the slides on the information document saved in Google Classroom (called 'North America Comparing a Region to the UK'). Next, pick a city or an area of North America. This could be New York, Las Vegas, San Francisco, Montreal or Kingston - anywhere you think you enjoy finding out about. Then, spend some time finding out about the human and physical features of this place. You could use Google Earth to get a good idea of what it looks like. Using the questions below, make notes on what you find out. After that, do the same for York or Leeds so that you have the same information for both places.

I think that this will take you quite a long time, so today you just need to investigate both areas and make notes about what you find out, using the questions below to help you. You can write down what you find out in your jotters, a piece of paper or type it onto a Google doc.

Terrain

Is the region hilly or flat? What is the highest elevation?

Water

Where is the nearest water source? Are there rivers or streams? Is the sea nearby?

Climate

What is the climate like? How does the climate change throughout the year?

Flora and Fauna

What kind of plants and animals would you find in this area?

Religion

What are the major religions in this area? How does this affect life in this region?

Employment

What kinds of jobs do people do here to earn a living? How many people are unemployed?

Leisure

What do people do for fun in this area? What indoor and outdoor activities are there?

Wealth

Is it a rich or a poor area? Is there a difference within the region?

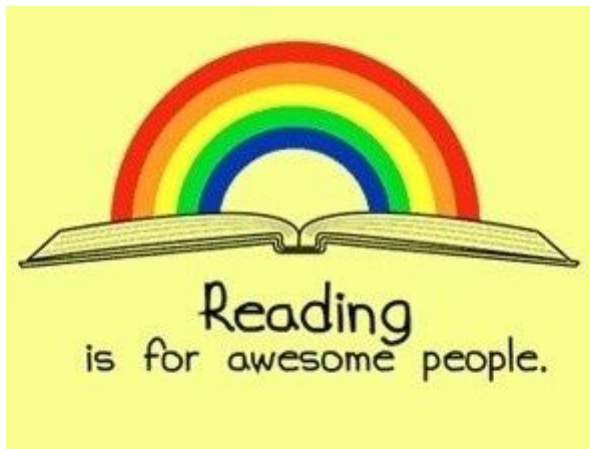
Festivals

What festivals or holidays do people celebrate here? How are they celebrated?

Buildings

What are the buildings like in this area? Are there any famous man-made landmarks?
