Week 8: Transport

Maths Tasks

- Daily numbots. You are doing great! Keep up the good work Acorns!
- **Number Recognition:** Can you write numbers 1-20? Play hide and seek with your numbers. Once you have found your numbers, can you put them in order correctly? Try big numbers once you have cracked this!
- **Number Writing:** Can you practise writing numbers 1-20? Try writing these in flour, playdoh and then with a pencil. Can you create a number line with post it notes? Say each number aloud. Can you write and order numbers beyond 20?



This week our focus is different ways of making 5. At school we would explore Numicon. You can do the same at home. Find [Numicon templates](#) on Twinkl.

- How many different ways can you make 5? Once you have explored making 5, can you write these as a number sentence?
- Can you tell a grown up what number you will have if you add one more or if you take one away?

What numicon pieces will help us make the number 5?

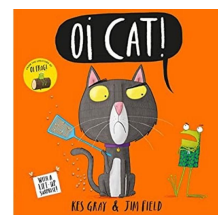
$3 + 2 = 5$	$4 + 1 = 5$	$5 + 0 = 5$

Reading Tasks

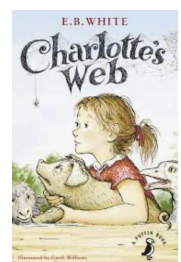
- Daily reading to a grown up. Can you tell a grown up what has happened in your story? How do you think the characters in your story might be feeling?
- Can you share some stories containing transport or stories about journeys with your grown-up? Look for on Oxford Owl, You Tube or on the Internet. For example: The Train Ride, Lost and Found, Mrs Armitage on Wheels.
- Can you be a sound spotter and see if you can spot some of the sounds you have been recapping around your house? These can be on cereal boxes or magazines.
- Watch ['The Bus is for Us'](#) on CBeebies Bedtime Stories read by Justin Fletcher.
- Listen to ['The Singing Mermaid'](#) By Julia Donaldson.



- Listen to ['Oi Cat'](#). Can you think of any other words that could rhyme with frog, dog and cat?

Daily Phonics/Spelling Tasks	Writing Tasks
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Have a look at the EYFS spelling mat on the school's website. Pick 5 words and practise spelling these. • At the end of the week get an adult to test you on the days of the week spellings. • Can you read these tricky 'sight' words? Can you write these in a sentence? Play 'Train your brain' on Phonics Play (login march/home). • Using the Reception Phonics sounds PowerPoint on the school website can you recap daily the sounds taught so far. Can you think of a word that uses that sound? Could you have a go at writing it? Once you have a word with phase 3 and 4 sounds in, can you sound button your word? • Can you make a 'Lucky Dip' with the school spelling mat words (available on the school website.) Put these words in a tub, take them out one at a time (NO PEEPING you cheeky monkeys) and read them out loud? 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Listen to 'Mr Gumpy's Outing'. • Can you think of some questions that you could ask Mr Gumpy? How did he feel about the events that took place that day? • Can you use speech bubbles for Mr Gumpy's answers to your questions? There are lots of speech bubble templates on Twinkl. • As our theme this week is transport, can you look at this picture of Darth's dream car? Can you write sentences telling how you would travel in style? Can you create your own crazy vehicle? Label your car, what makes it special? Can it fly? Does it have a super speed mode? • Write about a journey you have been on before with your family. Where did you go? How did you get there? What did you do when you got there? What was your favourite part of the trip? • Don't forget capital letters at the beginning of your sentences and full stops at the end. Use your spelling mat to help you spell tricky words. • Can you complete one of the Teach handwriting cursive formation sheets? If you can't print, can you copy from a tablet or computer screen?

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • How long can you skip on the spot for? See if you can improve your personal best every day this week! • Join in with Joe Wicks every morning at 9am for #PEwithJOE • Can you help wash your grown-ups cars or your own bike/scooter? • Imagine you are a type of transport and play the traffic light game you play in PE! Somebody has to shout "red", "amber" or "green" and you have to listen carefully and decide whether you need to stop, slow down or go. Think about how your chosen transport would travel, can you copy the actions of a train or an aeroplane while you play? See what others you can think of! 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Colouring is a great way to calm the mind. Can you colour in the pictures of the different types of transport? These are free to download and print from Twinkl available here - Transport Colouring Sheets. • Have a go at this Cosmic Kids Yoga all about Monkeys! • Do something that you really enjoy. This might be baking a yummy treat, playing in the garden or watching your favourite film.

Learning Project (Various activities covering the wider curriculum to be completed over the week)

- Can you make a model of Mr Gumpy's boat? Use materials from your recycling.
- Can you draw a picture showing all of the people and animals on the boat?



- Mr Gumpy lives in a house by a river. Can you draw a map to help others find Mr Gumpy's house? What might people pass on the way? How might you get to Mr Gumpy's house? What form of transport would you need?
- Can you research different vehicles from the past and compare them to vehicles of the present? Which would you prefer to travel in? How are they different? Draw or print out your favourite ones and tell me how they are different and why you like them.
- If you have some toy cars, trains or any other types of transport see if you can make a track/road for them to travel on. You could draw it on the floor with chalk or create one on some paper. Can you add some road signs for them to follow? Can you make a ramp for your vehicle to travel down?
- Often when you travel on public transport you need a ticket to get on. Can you make some tickets for your family? They could be train tickets, aeroplane tickets or bus tickets. If you wanted you could make a ticket booth for your family to come and buy a ticket from you!
- Can you do some research with a grown up and find out some facts about Amelia Earhart? Why is she famous? What did she do that has changed the world?

Spread the Happiness - 100 things to do indoors - Can you tick off another 5 things off the list?
