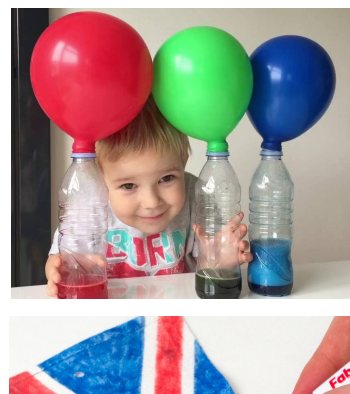
Mindfulness

Learning Project

Science - All parties need balloons! Have a go at this [cool experiment](#) to see what happens when vinegar and bicarbonate of soda mix together. Note: food colouring not required.



Art - Create some bunting to hang up for your tea party or in the window of your house for people to see during their daily exercise. Here's a [step-by-step guide](#).

D.T. - Follow a recipe and make celebration cupcakes or perhaps follow [this recipe](#) for a wartime Condensed Milk Cake.



History - Ask people in your family if they have any photos from the VE celebrations in 1995. Share photos together and ask them what they did and what it was like. You could ask grandparents, aunts and uncles if you video call them too!

R.E. - Forgiveness - Watch [The Prodigal Son PowerPoint](#). The Prodigal Son story is a parable (a simple story, told by Jesus in the Gospels, used to show a moral lesson) which illustrates the importance of grace and forgiveness over sin.

Computing - Make a quiz on 2simple for your family to do at your tea party. Your quiz can be about anything you want. Remember to only use the 'multiple choice' style questions like we did in class in the spring term.



Music - Listen to the song "[We'll Meet Again](#)" by Vera Lynn & Katherine Jenkins which is being released to raise money for NHS Charities Together. Can you learn how to sing it and perform the song at your tea party? Or perhaps you could make your own dance to go along with the song?
