Keep Active!

- Practice a static balance by doing squats. Keep both feet flat to the ground and your legs shoulder width apart.

- Be Active: Go on a local walk. Collect objects that you could use to make your mosaic.

- Reflect: You are too young to fast. However, almost all Muslims try to give up bad habits during Ramadan. It is a time for prayer and good deeds. They will try to spend time with family and friends and help people in need. What bad habit would you give up? Have you ever helped people in need?

The 2do activities on Purple Mash will become accessible to children on different days - similar to how the learning would take place in school. Some phonics and handwriting activities have been set as 2dos on Purple Mash for those children who still need to practice these.
