



Maths: Mixed Maths Practise

(You need to multiply the base by the height and divide the answer by 2.) The answers are on page 110.



There is also lots of information on the PowerPoint in the English folder on Google Classroom that you looked at on Tuesday.

There are a few things you need to remember:

- A balanced argument is balanced! You need to present both arguments equally.
 It is written in third person until the last paragraph when you can share your own
 views. You can't be at all persuasive as it is not a persuasive text it is explaining
 both sides of an argument fairly.
- 2. You need to use lots of fronted adverbials to make your writing cohesive such as the examples below:

Useful sentence starters for a balanced argument

However... Firstly... Research suggests... Consequently...

Although... Finally... Studies show... Therefore...


On the other hand... Furthermore... It is well known that... For this reason...

On the contrary... Also... Statistics show that... As a result of this...

In contrast... In addition to this... It is common knowledge that...

3. You need an introductory paragraph, one paragraph listing some points for why people may think it is graffiti, one listing some points explaining why people may think it is art and a concluding paragraph explaining what you think.

Your balanced argument doesn't need to be too long. Aim for quality not quantity! There is an assignment in Google Classroom called, 'Graffiti Balanced Argument' for you to write it on.

Science: How do we see?

Our new science topic is 'Light' so we will be finding out all about light, shadows, reflections and how we see. Today, you will be investigating how our eyes work. Start by looking at the slides in Google Classroom called, 'Science Slides Light' which tell you about how our eyes work. Spend time looking at your eye in the mirror. See what happens to your pupil when you go from a dark area into light.

When you have found out all about the different parts of our eye and how they work together, you need to create a labelled diagram of an eye to show what you have found out. As well as labelling the drawing, you need to write a short explanation about what each part does to help us see. You could add some interesting facts about eyes too.
