here will help you. **Don't forget the zero place holder!** For the division questions, you will be able to use the short bus stop method; none of the numbers really need the longer chunking method. The answers are on the next sheet so don't look too far ahead before you have finished!

### Art: WW2 Air raid picture

If you would like to do some art today, you could have a go at a picture like these.

- Start by doing a sunset using your watercolours, thinking about how to mix the colours to create an effective sky.
- Add the search light beams using white paper. If you look carefully, the beams are narrower when they leave the light on the ground and become wider.
- Finally, cut out silhouettes of buildings and planes. If you don't have black card, you could use paint or felt tips, or look through your recycling to see if you have anything dark in there.

### History: Investigating a famous figure from WW2

There are so many important and interesting people from WW2 who are still talked about today. I would like you to investigate one of the most famous: Winston Churchill or Anne Frank. These are two very different individuals, one was a Prime Minister and the other was a young Jewish girl, yet both can tell us so much about what happened during the war.



You need to pick one of these historical figures, and investigate who they were, what they did and the impact this had on others.

Then, you need to create something to show all of the interesting things you have found out. This could be a Google Doc or Slides, a poster or any other method of sharing the information. You might choose to show your information using labelled drawings or through a comic strip or booklet; just choose whatever you would enjoy to do the most.
