Maths Tasks


- Keep going on your Numbots adventures try to do it daily if you can.
- Can you practise your place value by completing this sequencing activity on <u>Purple Mash?</u>
- Can you count in 2's up to 100? Practise by using the paint the square 100 square to notice the pattern. Then complete the counting in 2's activity on <u>Purple Mash</u>.
- This week we are thinking about TIME.
 Although we have only talked about time a little in Willow lots of you can already tell the time.

Make your own clock using a paper plate and split pins. In Year 1 we only learn about 'o' clock and half past times. Remember that the long hand is always on

12 for 'o' clock and 6 for 'half past' the hour.

The short hand tells you which hour it is.

Writing Tasks

- each spelling? Choose 5 words write a sentence for each one.
- Play the game on <u>Purple Mash</u> to recap 'wh' and 'ph'.
- Recap suffixes ('s' and 'es') by playing the memory game on <u>Purple Mash</u>.
- Can you complete the suffix activities on this <u>powerpoint?</u>
- How many words can spell from the Year 1 spelling mat? Make a list of the words you still need to learn to spell and practise spelling 5 each week.
- At the end of the week ask an adult to test you on these words.

You will need to include:-

- Person's name
- Party location, date and time
- Reason for the tea party
- Dress Code
- Write a menu for the guests at your VE day party.
 Use your best handwriting!
- Create your own name cards for the guests at your party. Decorate them, make sure you use a tall capital letter for each name and that you use your best handwriting!





 This is the handwriting scheme we follow at school. Try to do some handwriting practice weekly. Practise writing the letters of the alphabet - we start all our letters from the line.

Keep Active!

- Join in with <u>Joe Wicks</u> every morning at 9am for #PEwithJOE
- Keep active by learning to do the <u>swing</u> dance (Lindy Hop). This was a popular dance during the 1930's and 1940's.
- Get active with <u>Jump Start Jonny's</u> Gangnam Style workout. Can you remember your moves?

Mindfulness

- Listening to audio stories is a good way to relax. Listen to this episode of <u>Horrid</u> <u>Henry meets the Queen.</u>
- Practise your <u>Tao Chi</u> to calm your mind and relax your body.
- At the moment there are lots of things that we all 'wish' we could do. Start a 'wish jar'. Everytime you wish you could do something like play with your friends or go to the beach - write the wish on a piece of paper and put it in a jar. Decorate your 'wish' jar and keep it somewhere safe. When things are back to normal - choose a wish each week to do.

History - Watch this clip of <u>VE celebrations</u> in 1945. Does anyone in your family (Great Grandparents or Great Uncles/Aunts) remember these celebrations? Ask your family if they have any photos/memories of the VE day celebrations in 1995 - talk about what it was lik.

Music - Listen to <u>'Run, Rabbit, Run!'</u> by Flanagan and Allen. This is a famous wartime song. Can you learn the words and perform it for your VE party guests?

RE - Read the story of <u>The Lost Sheep</u>. Think about the story of The Prodigal Son from last week. How is this story similar.? How did the Shepherd feel when he found the lost sheep?

Computing - Using the art tools on <u>Purple Mash</u> can you create a Union Jack flag to celebrate VE day? Use the animated stories programme to write your own version of The Lost Sheep - can you make a front cover and a page for the blurb too? I have set 2dos for these activities.
