Summer Week 4: Somewhere up there!



Maths Tasks

- Daily [numbots](#). If you haven't been on Numbots yet give it a try! This week I will be sending a special Marvellous Me to those children who complete more than 30 minutes over the week.
- Recap [Ordinal Numbers](#). Complete the 2do on Purple Mash. There are lots of ordinal number activities to do on [Twinkl](#).

This week is all about making sure you are really confident with number bonds, fact families and addition and subtraction within 20.

- Practise [number bonds to 20](#).
- Can you complete the number bonds to 20 2do on [Purple Mash](#).
- Find all the number sentences that go in the same fact family on this [Purple Mash](#) 2do.
- Can you complete these [word problems](#) using addition?
- Make a [mathopoly](#) game and practise your addition and subtraction within 20.
- Have a go at [space themed addition and subtraction facts up to 20](#).
- Solve the missing number addition and subtraction questions on this [Purple Mash](#) 2do.
- If you are confident within 20 - challenge yourself with these [Twinkl addition and subtraction word problems](#) - beware they are quite tricky!
- For something different take a look at these [Spring maths](#) activities.

Reading Tasks

- Share books with an adult daily. How many different types of books do you have at home?
- Read [Back to Earth with Bump](#) with an adult. You could each take turns to read a sentence. Can you make a list of some of the rhyming words you can hear in the story?
- Listen to [How to catch a Star](#) by Oliver Jeffers.
- Can you make your own star?



- How would you catch your own star? Write down your ideas.
- Listen to [A Busy Day for Birds](#) by Lucy Cousins. Can you retell the story to an adult? Can you use great expression when you are retelling the story?

Daily Phonics/Spelling Tasks

- Use the Willow sounds powerpoint on the school website. Practise saying all the sounds we have learnt. Write each sound on a post it note, stick the notes around the house. Every time you pass the sound, say it out loud and think of a word with that sound.



Writing Tasks

- Can you make a list on this [rocket](#) of ten things you would take with you if you were travelling to space?
- Write your own version of How to Catch a Star. What could you change in the story? Could you catch a cloud, a raindrop, a fairy or a dragon? Can you do some super drawings to go with your story and make it look like a real book? Can you follow these instructions to make your own mini book template? You may need an adult to help you.

- Think about the 'oo' sound family - look at the last slide on the powerpoint to remind you. How many words can you write for each spelling? Choose 5 words - write a sentence for each one.
- How many words can spell from the Year 1 spelling mat? Make a list of the words you still need to learn to spell and practise spelling 5 each week.
- At the end of the week ask an adult to test you on these words.
- Complete this [Purple Mash](#) 2do to recap split digraphs.

- Write a book review for your favourite book this week. Write it on a piece of paper or use this [Twinkl book review sheet](#).

Remember to use finger spaces, full stops and capital letters in all your writing. Always practise your neatest handwriting and use the spelling mat to help you spell those tricky words.

- Complete the Sam and Pat play ball 2do on [Purple Mash](#). Read the sentences and decide which conjunction (and, but or so) is the correct one to use.
- [This](#) is the handwriting scheme we follow at school. Try to do some handwriting practice weekly. Practise writing the letters of the alphabet - we start all our letters from the line.

Keep Active!

- Have a go at [Circuit Training at the workout hotel](#).
- Can you practise counting in 2's, 5's and 10's whilst doing star jumps or jogging on the spot?

- Practise some [Yoga outdoors](#) with Adriene - stretch your body and calm your mind.

- Look at this [website](#) about the Solar System with an adult - Can you write a fact for each planet?

- Make a [paper mache planet](#) - which is your favourite?
