# This week in maths we are recapping 2D & 3D shape.

- Challenge yourself with this <u>Twinkl 3D</u> <u>shapes</u> powerpoint.
- Can you find some string or ribbon and make some 2D shapes outside.
- Make a magic shape finder. Use it to investigate 2D & 3D shape around the house and outside. Use this 3D shape poster to remind you about the properties of each shape. It also shows you some of the everyday objects that are 3D shapes which ones can you spot?
- Make a shape investigation booklet. Use this <u>Twinkl\_template</u> or make your own.
- Can you complete these <u>2D</u> and <u>3D shape</u> challenges?
- Can you sort 2D & 3D shapes on <u>Purple</u> Mash?
- Challenge yourself against the clock with these matching shapes memory games on <u>Purple Mash</u>.

# Reading and Listening Tasks

- Read with an adult every day.
- Choose a non-fiction book on your <u>Oxford Ow</u>l account. Write a book review for it on <u>Purple Mash</u>.
- With an adult read all about <u>Mavis the</u> <u>Magical Cat</u> and complete some of the reading activities.
- Listen to the story of a boy called <u>Cake</u> on BBC Bitesize -\_complete the activities about the extract you have read.
- One of my favourites! Read along to <u>Hairy Maclary</u>. Which dog would you choose?
- Something a bit different! Take a look at this <u>BBC Bitesize activity</u> which is all about different types (genres) of writing. You can also write a prediction for one of my very favourite books - The Magic Faraway Tree.
- Read all the words from the Y1 spelling mat. Challenge yourself - how many words can you read correctly in 1 minute? Use the online bomb timer like we do in class.

# Daily Phonics/Spelling Tasks

- Think about the 'oo' sound family look at the last slide on the powerpoint to remind you. How many words can you write for each spelling? Choose 5 words - write a sentence for each one.
- Try one of these activities to practise the 'oo' sound family:-
  - Spelling activity
  - o Roll and read game
  - o Soellina arid
- Continue to practise spelling the Year 1 words from the spelling mat. You need to be able to spell all of these words correctly before you move up to Year 2.
- Practise the ones you find tricky using rainbow writing.

#### Writing Tasks

 Watch the clip of Whistleless the bird who couldn't whistle. Can you retell the story to an adult? Write your own short story about 'Whistleless. Can you draw beautiful illustrations to go with your story? Make it into a minibook using a template from Twinkl.

Remember to use finger spaces, full stops and capital letters in all your writing. Always practise your neatest handwriting and use the spelling mat to help you spell those tricky words.

- Practise writing a list by completing this 2do on <u>Purple Mash</u>. Remember to use a comma after each item.
- Complete the 'Jim take out the rubbish' 2do on <u>PurpleMash</u>. This is to practise capital letters, full stops, question and exclamation marks.
- Put these sentences in the correct order to make a story on <u>PurpleMash</u>. Then



 Find some chalk and practise writing the ones you find tricky outside. How big can you make your letters? Make sure you form each letter correctly.



- have a go at writing your own story.
- Wednesday 20th May is 'National Thank a Teacher Day'. Why not write a letter/postcard or draw a picture and send it in to school? Staff in school love to get post from children and it is always shared with staff members working from home too!
- This is the handwriting scheme we follow at school. Try to do some handwriting practice weekly. Practise writing the letters of the alphabet - we start all our letters from the line.

### Learning Project

(Various activities covering the wider curriculum to be completed over the week)

Science/DT - Make a <u>straw rocket</u>. How far can you make it fly? Use your measuring skills and a tape measure to check the distance in metres and centimetres. Can you make a bigger or smaller rocket to see if it flies better or further?

D&T - Can you make a bird feeder from a milk carton? Take a look at this <u>website</u> for step by step instructions.



Art - Can you create some 'wild art?' Take a look at the <u>National Trust website</u> for inspiration. Andy Goldsworthy is an artist who uses natural materials to produce much of his artwork. Look at this <u>powerpoint</u> to see some of his ideas.





PSHE - Listen to the story of <u>The Little Princess</u> who doesn't want to wash her hands. Can you remember why we need to be extra careful about washing our hands at the moment? Can you make your own poster to remind everyone in your house how to wash their hands? Can you follow the steps to draw the <u>Little Princess</u> too?

History - Can you remember when we compared old and new toys? Look at the old toys on the slideshow on <u>Purple Mash</u>. How do you know these are old toys? What materials are they made of? Can you complete the 2do on <u>Purple Mash?</u> You need to write about old and new toys.

Geography - Think about what we have learnt about the seasons in Year 1. Test your knowledge and complete the Seasons Quiz on <u>Purple Mash</u>. I have set a 2do.

Computing - Complete the Seasons Trees 2do on <u>Purple Mash</u>. Think about how the trees change across the seasons.

Do you like making paper aeroplanes? Follow this link to find out the best 10 paper plane designs. Which plane design will travel the furthest? How many of the different designs can you make?
