Summer Week 6: Changes - Seasons and Weather




This weeks home learning is all about seasons and weather - there are lots

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Maths Tasks	Reading and Listening Tasks
• Keep going on your Numbots adventures - try to do it daily if you can. Remember if you complete 30 minutes over the week I will send you a special badge on Purple Mash.	 Try to read something different with an adult every day. This could be a chapter book, leaflet, cereal box, recipe or comic. Read the book <u>Season Swap</u>
This week we are thinking about MONEY. In Year 1 you need to be able to recognise and count coins - 1p, 2p, 5p, 10p, 20p, 50p, £1 and £2 coins. If possible look at 'real' coins. Notice the numbers and design on coin - what colour is it?	
• Set up your own shop! Practise pricing items, buying these items, and working out the change you might need afterward. It could be a junk model shop, nature shop or a Toy shop.	 Think about how the weather is different in in each season. Write a fact from the book about what the weather is like in each season. Listen to this non-fiction book about the

 Try these different <u>coins games</u> on Top Marks. 	How many different types of clouds are there? Can you write some facts about clouds? Use the book to help you.
• This <u>money game</u> is fun but make sure you choose the easy option.	• Listen to the story of <u>'The Great Pet Sale'</u> .

By the end of Year 1 you need to be confident counting forwards and backwards in 2's, 5's and 10's - Try this fun activity.	Sale
Put post it notes (or paper and sellotape) on your stairs to practise counting in 2s, 5s or 10s. When you walk up the stairs you must say the number! When you get really good, have a go without the post it notes.	Can you find the answers to these questions in the book? What was missing on the rat's face? Which animals cost 5p at the pet shop?

	What did the rat call the salamander, the skink and the gecko? How much money did the boy have to spend? Which animals did the boy buy?

• Complete the counting in 5's and counting in 10's number sequences on <u>Purple Mash</u> .	
Daily Phonics/Spelling Tasks	Writing Tasks
 Read all the sounds from the phonics powerpoint. Challenge yourself - how many sounds can you read correctly in 1 minute? Use the <u>online bomb timer</u> like we do in class. Think about the 'ow' sound family - look at the last slide on the powerpoint to remind you. How many words can you write for each spelling? Choose 5 words - write a sentence for each one. Complete the <u>spelling frame</u> games for Spelling Rule 17 and 18 - 'ow' and 'ow'. Meekly Spellings Starting from this week you will have a list of 6 words to practise each week. Remember to ask an adult to test you on them at the end of the week. This week's spellings are: about again any are friend really These are words that we use a lot in our reading and writing. Would you need an umbrella, sunglasses or wellington boots for your weather? Watch this clip for some ideas. This is the handwriting scheme we follow at school. Try to do some handwriting practice weekly. Practise writing the letters of the alphabet - we start all our letters from the line.
