This week revises drawing and discovering equivalent fractions.</li> <li>You can also revise maths topics covered earlier by accessing previous weeks or year groups.</li> <li>Revise rounding numbers using the following <u>supermovers</u></li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Share books daily and practise your home reader.</li> <li>Choose a book from <u>Oxford Owls</u> to read. Try to choose something that you wouldn't normally pick.</li> <li>Read chapter 2 of Horde of Ravens on Purple Mash. Later in the week, you will be given a 2do quiz about what you have read. Reading it more than once will help you answer the questions.</li> <li>Keep up-to-date with positive news from around the world on the <u>Twinkl Home Learning Hub</u>. Look at the newsroom daily bulletin and then complete the associated reading comprehension. <ul> <li>Access the spellings revision quiz on the Purple Mash 2do.</li> <li>Pick up some tips on spelling using <u>supermovers</u> and practice spelling rules.</li> <li>Our spellings for this week are a revision of the 's' sound within words spelt with ce :</li> <li>sentence notice recent innocent parcel process grocer December distance voice</li> <li>Practice these daily using look/cover/check, or writing them in a crossword or using rainbow colours. Remember to check the meanings using a dictionary.</li> <li>Some children have words ending -il (pencil) to revise on their 2do.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Practise your handwriting daily. This is the perfect opportunity to send a handwritten letter to a family member or friend. If you have a touchscreen device, you could use 2Handwrite on Purple Mash - exploring different writing implements.</li> <li>Your grammar activity this week is Mark wants chicken and is an introduction to inverted commas to punctuate direct speech.</li> <li>Remind yourself about inverted commas by doing the following <u>supermovers</u>.</li> <li>On the BBC home learning website, this week, the <u>History</u> project also looks at the Roman conquest. Watch the video and complete a comic strip of the Roman invasion and how the Celts fought back.</li> </ul>

Try raising your other foot off the ground in front, behind or to the side of you.
