

Maths - Equivalent fractions, decimals and percentages

English - Story writing: creating an effective setting description.

In order to write a story that is full of interest and detail, you need to include effective descriptions of the settings so the reader can picture where the action takes place. To do this, you need to appeal to the readers' senses, thinking about what the characters can see, hear, smell, touch and taste.

You then need to pick a picture on one of the following slides to describe. If you would rather, you could find a picture of a setting online to describe. (Please could you copy and paste this on to the Google Doc if you do this.) There is a document in Google Classroom for you to describe your setting on. You can write it in first person as if you are walking through the setting if that is easier for you.

Geography/History: Investigating York

Today, you are going to be finding out more about the city of York. First, spend some time on Google Earth exploring the main place in the city. (The 3D view is really effective.) https://earth.google.com/web/

See if you can find the following: the station, the Minster, the Museum Gardens, Coppergate, the point where York's two rivers meet, the hospital, Nestle's factory and The Shambles.



Then, I would like you to find the answers to these questions:

- 1. Who was George Hudson and what is he famous for?
- 2. How long did the Minster take to build?
- 3. What are the names of the two rivers in York?
- 4. What is the Foss Barrier and what does it do?
- 5. When was Clifford's Tower built and who built it?
- 6. Who was Joseph Rowntree and what were his main achievements?
- 7. What are the names of the four main gatehouses (or bars) on the famous city walls?

I have created a Google Slides document with a page for each question. You need to answer the question with as much detail as you can, and include a relevant picture. If you want to, you could add extra slides with other answers to questions you have about this fantastic city.

This is quite a long activity, so you probably won't get it all done today.
