
Most of all enjoy and remember to keep on smiling!


Maths Tasks

 Numbots - Keep going! If you complete 30 minutes over the week I will send you a special badge on Purple Mash. 11 children have earned over 12,000 coins.

This week in maths we are thinking about fractions. This is new learning for us so for now just think about finding a half (½) or a quarter (¼) of an object or shape. You need to learn that 2 equal parts or 4 equal parts makes a whole.

Watch this <u>youtube</u> clip to help you.





- Can you find some 2D shapes (circle, square, triangle, rectangle) to draw round?
 - You could draw round the side of a cereal box, a plastic cup, or a baked beans tin whatever you have at home. Fold the shape into halves or quarters Then colour a half (½) or a quarter (¼) of the shape.
- Could you make a fruit salad and practise cutting the fruit into halves or quarters?





- Can you read and colour the fractions on this activity sheet from <u>Twinkl</u>.
- Make a paper plate pizza and practise cutting it into halves or quarters.


Reading and Listening Tasks

- Try to read something different with an adult every day. This could be a chapter book, leaflet, cereal box, recipe or comic.
- In Year 1 you need to practise 'retrieving' (find or extract) information from a piece of text. This reading lesson from BBC Bitesize is about a book called Cyril and Pat by Emily Gravett who is the author of Meerkat Mail.




There are lots of questions to help you practise finding the answers in the text. Remember to write your answer in a sentence.


• Listen to the story of <u>'Supertato'</u> by Sue Hendra and Paul Linnet.

 Can you make a list of all the rhyming words you can hear in the story?




- Complete the 2do on <u>Purple Mash</u>

Writing Tasks

- Write sentences describing your superhero. Can you include some amazing adjectives in your writing?

that they were coming to your house for tea. What would you say to them? Make a list of questions that you would like to ask them. Remember to use a ? at the end of each question.



 Think about which action words your superhero might say. Make your own superhero speech bubbles like these.
 Make sure you use an exclamation mark!!!

Science - Linking to our Weather topic from last week. Can you make a <u>rain cloud in a jar</u>. Using simple ingredients found at home, make the 'cloud' become so heavy that 'rain' begins to fall.

Art - Create some Superhero 'Pop Art' in the style of <u>Roy Lichtenstein</u> Use paints, felt tips or wax crayons to create this stunning effect.





Get ahead for Father's Day (Sunday 21st June) by making a Superhero hand print Father's Day card.



Computing - Write about your Superhero or write a Superhero story on <u>Purple Mash</u>. Use your English skills to help the <u>Small Town Superheroes</u> solve some of the mysteries that happen in Small Town.

Music - Linking to our weather topic from last week - can you make a <u>rainstick</u>. If you don't have a poster tube, the tube inside tin foil will work. Hammering nails is a great hand-eye coordination skill.



RE/PSHCE - What makes a good friend?

Watch this <u>clip</u> to find out what some children think about friends. Can you make a card for one of your friends from Willow Class. Write the reasons why you think they are a good friend inside the card
