




Reading Tasks


Our book this week is:

*Jack and the Beanstalk.*

- Can you read this story or watch it on YouTube?



- Can you retell the story in your own words?



- What does the giant say in the story?

*Fee! Fie! Foe! Fum!

## Daily Phonics Tasks

Every day we will be looking at a new sound in class. Can you find objects around your house beginning with this sound? Can you sort objects by their initial sound?



Watching Jolly Phonics videos on YouTube is a good way of introducing letter sounds, e.g. *Jolly Phonics m*. This teaches children the sound through a fun song and actions. This week the letters we will be looking at are:

Monday: Letter g

Tuesday: Letter o

Wednesday: Letter c

Thursday: Letter k

Friday: Can children sort objects beginning with g, o, c and k (i.e. putting objects next to the letters they begin with)?

Remember to use your letter sounds flashcards (you can find them on the school website, go to: *Classes, Mercury*).

Can you have a go at recording the letters on a piece of paper?

Can you practise reading the tricky words: *I, no, the, go* and *into*. Can you make a matching set for your child to make pairs with? Can you place them around the house so your child can go on a word hunt?


## Maths Tasks



This week we are looking at the number 3. You can find out all about number three with Numberblocks on YouTube: <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Bkufsme9qiA>  
Can you find three objects in the house? Remember to take some photos of what you have found!



We are looking at using the words 'more' and 'fewer' to describe two sets of objects this week. Watch the story *A Squash and A Squeeze* on YouTube.



Can you make two piles of toys. Which pile has more/ fewer? How do you know this? Encourage your child to count them all to check they are right.

Can you give your child a number, e.g. 5, and ask them to collect this amount of toys?

Can your child make two towers using Lego, wooden bricks or Duplo? Which tower is the tallest and has the most bricks? Which tower is the smallest and has the fewest bricks? Can your child count how many bricks they have used to make each tower?

## Learning Project

- Look at the story *Jack and the Beanstalk*. Can you create your own beanstalk?



- Can you find out about beanstalks?
