





Reading Tasks


This week we will be looking at a range of books on the topic of Autumn.

Daily Phonics Tasks

Every day we will be looking at a new sound in class.



Watching Jolly Phonics videos on YouTube is a good way of introducing letter sounds, e.g. *Jolly Phonics m*. This teaches children the sound through a fun song and actions. This week we will be learning:

Monday: Digraph ll. Look at *The //l/ phoneme - Mr Thorne Does Phonics* on YouTube <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=r3YtQuyS1fc>

Tuesday: Letter ss. Look at *Mr Thorne does Phonics, The /ss/ spelling pattern* on YouTube: <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=6GOG-CEVXis>

Wednesday: Have a go at reading words such as: cat, dog, pig, hen. Or, you could watch the YouTube video and have a go at reading the words: *Practice Blending Sounds for Reading- CVC Words* <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=3ovJIXTQpsU>

Thursday: Have a go at reading words such as: mat, pan, sit, tin. Practise blending with *Phonics CVC Words Reading with Phoneme Fingers* <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=2ZzK8VIMpq8>

Friday: Practise reading the tricky words - *I, no, the, go and into*. Watch this song and it will help you remember them! *Tricky Words and Sight Words Song* on YouTube <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=TvMyssfAUx0>

Remember to use your letter sounds flashcards (you can find them on the school website, go to: *Classes, Mercury*).

Can you have a go at recording the letters on a piece of paper?

Can you practise reading the tricky words: I, no, the, go to and into? Can you make a matching set for your child to make pairs with? Can you place them around the house so your child can go on a word hunt? Look at this video on YouTube: Tricky Words *Sight Words Song for I, go, to, no, is, the*

We are looking at numbers 1 to 5 this week. Can you order numbers to 5?




Do you recognise numbers to 5 when they are shown in a random order? Can you sing *Five Little Ducks*? What happens to the numbers of ducks as you sing the song?




Can you sing *Five Little Speckled Frogs*?


