## Maths Tasks

**Reception** - Recap learning on ordering and counting objects. Practise counting to 20. Use the flash cards and show the children numbers 1 to 10 in a random order and see if they can say the numbers out loud.

Can you subitise to 5? Lay out objects 1-5 on the floor. Can children tell you how many there are without needing to touch count?


Keep practising your learning from this week. You're doing a great job! Can you practice forming your numbers correctly?

Can you recap your learning with the following questions?

- B- What does greater than, less than and equal to mean? What do the symbols look like?
- C- Can you draw part whole models for number bonds to 10?


**Level 1** - Can you show and write number bonds to 10?

**Level 3** - Challenge


There are 9 sweets altogether.

- Do you have a favourite story book that Mummy and Daddy read to you at bed time? I would love to hear all about it! Can you be a sound spotter the next time you listen to a story and see if you can spot any sounds we have learnt?

Daily Phonics/Spelling Tasks	Writing Tasks
<p><b>Reception</b> - Sing the alphabet with Mummy and Daddy. Make sure you point to each letter as you sing. Recap previous sounds. See PP on the school's website.</p> <p>Write the sounds we have learnt so far this week. ll and ss Go over the actions and songs that go with each of them.</p> <p>Can you go over the tricky words from this week? Can you say them in a sentence to a grown up?</p> <p><b>Year 1</b> - Recap phase 2 and 3 sounds. Please see phonics powerpoint on the schools website. Can you think of any words with the oa, or and ow sound? Don't forget to sound button. Can you do your actions?</p> <p>This week we are not learning any new graphemes.</p> <p>Today I would like you to recap your learning of CVCC words from this week. Use PP to go over your learning.</p> <p>Can you recap the tricky words from yesterday?</p> <p><b>Remember:</b></p> <p><b>there</b> - there are ...</p> <p>- over there ...</p> <p><b>were</b> - we were ...</p> <p>they were ..</p> <p><b>when</b> - sounds like wen - can't hear h.</p> <p><b>not</b> - We can sound out but knot (the type we make) has a silent k.</p>	<p><b>Reception</b> - Keep practising writing your name. Use the name cards sent on Friday to help you remember the order of the letters in your name. Don't forget the first letter in your name needs to be a capital letter.</p> <p>Can you practise writing your letters? Make sure you write them in cursive. You can find the cursive alphabet on our website.</p> <p>Can you have a go at writing some words using the sound you have learnt in your phonics?</p> <p><b>Year 1</b> - Today I would like you to finish off your sentences for your red scarf if you haven't already.</p> <p>Use what you have learnt so far in our writing to create your own story. What might your story be about? Can you draw your 4 main points to help you?</p> <p>You might want to describe how your character is feeling. Instead of using the word happy, can you think of other words that also mean happy? Joyful, content, cheerful, jolly, delighted.</p> <p>You might want to write about your time at home this week. Or write a letter to a friend explaining how much you have missed them and why.</p> <p>Can you write today's full date? Friday 23rd October 2020.</p>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Can you practise throwing and catching a ball? This will work your arm muscle which will help you with your writing! How many times can you throw and catch a ball in 1 minute?</li> <li>• Can you use your listening ears and repeat the actions to <a href="#">Boom Chicka Boom?</a></li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Which <a href="#">cosmic yoga</a> is your favourite? There are loads you can try this week.</li> <li>• Can you draw yourself as a superhero? What would your superpowers be? Can you pose like a superhero?</li> </ul>

Practise learning the actions for each letter. This will help you further in the year with your writing.</p> <p><a href="#">Phonicsplay.co.uk</a> provides games for your child to play which are linked to the sound they are working on. Look</p>	

in Resources, Phase 2 (Reception) and Phase 3 (Year 1) pick the sound you would like your child to learn. Year 1 children can recap phase 2 sounds.
