


This week we will be looking at *On Sudden Hill* by Linda Sarah

Daily Phonics Tasks

Every day we will be looking at a new sound in class.




Watching Jolly Phonics videos on YouTube is a good way of introducing letter sounds, e.g. *Jolly Phonics m*. This teaches children the sound through a fun song and actions. This week we will be learning:

**Monday: Letter i.**


Can you have a go at writing words containing i: *sit, bin, pip, sip* and *pin*.




Can you make a 'm' booklet? Can you write the following words (one per page): *map, mat* and *man*? Can you illustrate your booklet?

Can you practise reading the tricky words: I, no, the, go, to and into? Can you make a matching set to play pairs with? Can an adult place them around the house so you can go on a word hunt? Can you add one more to any number up to 5 using your toys?

For example, if I have 3 cars and I add 1 more, how many do I have altogether?



Once you feel confident with 1 to 5, can you make yourself a number line from 1 to 10 by placing numbered pieces of paper on the floor in order?



Now choose a number on the number line and place the right number of objects on it (e.g. if you choose 6, place 6 objects on the piece of paper marked '6'). Can you guess what 6 add one more is? Remember when you are adding one more the answer is always the next number on the number line.
