We will be finishing our learning on the Industrial Revolution by investigating the work of Dr Barnardo and Lord Shaftsbury, thinking about the impact their actions had on children living in poverty, in Victorian England. Our geography learning will involve us looking at the development of human environments in North America, thinking about the impact industrialisation has had on different parts of the continent.

Science: This half term, our science topic is Living Things and their Habitats. We will be finding out how living things are classified and looking at the work of the scientists, Carl Linnaeus and Marjory Stoneman Douglas.

Maths: We started our fractions topic just before half term, and this new learning continues for most of this term. We will be investigating how to add, subtract, multiple and divide fractions, before moving on to finding fractions of an amount.

English: We are approaching the end of our class book, Cogheart, and will then be reading Street Child by Berlie Doherty. This is a historical story about a Victorian child who escapes the workhouse in 1860's London and his desperate battle for survival.

Our writing will include a formal letter to our MP about a current issue, as part of UK Parliament Week, and a diary entry, in character as Scrooge. Bah humbug!

It has been lovely to see the class back in school this week, refreshed and ready to get going. We are really looking forward to this half term, which will be full of great learning and exciting Christmas preparation!
