$5+7$


$6+7$

Extra Maths (This is optional)


Can you practice your subtraction skills. Can you count backwards to find the answer? Ask a grown up to think of some number sentences for you to answer.

 - What was baby bear pretending to be?
 - How do you think Mr Bear felt in the morning?

<p>Reception - Today I would like you to learn the new trigraph ure. A trigraph is when three letters make one sound. Can you say it to a grown up? Can you have a go at writing it in our special writing? Can you practice drawing the sound button underneath?</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><u>ure</u></p> <p>Watch Geraldine the Giraffe and encourage your child to repeat the sound. Encourage your child to repeat the sound.</p> <p>Can you repeat the words with Geraldine? Can you say them in a sentence to a grown up?</p> <p>Can you read words: pure, sure, cure, manure, mixture</p> <p>Can you have a go at writing your own sentence using one of the words above?</p> <p style="text-align: center;">I am sure I can add a cure to the mixture.</p> <p>Year 1 - This week we are looking at the 'oo' family for alternative spellings. This can be tricky so just try your best! We will be going over this on your return to school so don't worry!</p> <p>Use the Phonics PP on Venus Class page on the school's website. Just like we do at school, sing the alphabet with a grown up or sibling.</p> <p>What sentences can you create with the alternative oo spellings? Don't forget to use your sound buttons to help you. When you are looking at the different oo graphemes - think about where you can hear the oo in a word? is it at the front, middle or end?</p>	<p>Reception and Year 1 - Today I would like you to write some sentences telling me about your half term. It's okay if you feel you didn't do a lot, neither did Miss Hendrickson!</p> <p>During half term I spent lots of time with Darcy relaxing and going for walks. I really enjoyed half term because I did not have to set an alarm!</p> <p>During half term Darcy and I had a movie night and we watched Mary Poppins. I loved half term because I got to spend time with my family.</p> <p>Year 1 - Can you use the conjunctions 'and' or because in your sentences? Can you include how you felt during half term? Don't forget your capital letters, full stops and finger spaces!</p> <p>Reception - Think of your sentences with a grown up. Count the words in your sentence on your fingers and try and sound out each word. Can you draw a picture to match your sentence?</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Can you write today's date: Monday 22nd February 2021</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • This is the handwriting scheme we follow at school. Try to do some handwriting practice weekly. Practise writing the letters of the alphabet - we start all our letters from the line. • 7 Days of the Week Song - We like this song in Venus class. History - This term in history we are looking at our own personal history and how Church Fenton has changed over time.

Today I would like you to take some time with a grown up to look at photos of different members of your family. You might have photos from when they were little. Can you see how they have changed over time? Can you look at baby photos of yourself? How have you changed?

How long have you lived in Church Fenton or in your village? Did Mummy and Daddy live there before you were born? Has anything in your village changed that you can remember? A new shop might have been built or more houses.

If you do find photos of your relatives along with baby photos, keep them safe as you will need these next week!

Mums and Dads - if you grew up in Church Fenton or went to Kirk Fenton Primary as a child and have any photos, I would be incredibly grateful if you could share these with me as well as your child at home. It would be so lovely to see how the village and school have changed over time as well as hearing your own experiences of the village and school as a child.
