What we are learning...

Our learning this term is all about innovations and inventions. We are investigating the Industrial Revolution in history, focussing on the inventions that made the revolution possible, the impact the changes in industry had on towns and cities, and the experiences of working children at this time in history. As part of this learning we will be exploring the work of L.S. Lowry, thinking about what his paintings show us about life in an industrialised city and recreating our own art in the style of Lowry.

Science: We have lots of exciting science to investigate this half term. Our science topic is Evolution and Inheritance, so we will be finding out about how animals adapt to their environment, who Charles Darwin was and what he discovered about the evolution of species.

Maths: Our maths learning this half term will involve building on our knowledge of the formal written methods of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division, before moving onto our biggest year 6 maths topic: fractions.

English: Our first class novel is Street Child by Berlie Doherty. Our writing will include creating a recount of a day in the life of a working Victorian child, and a report on a newly discovered, imagined, new species.
