



Our learning this term continues to be about innovations and inventions. In history, we are exploring child labour during the Industrial Revolution, focussing on new laws passed in the era to protect the most vulnerable child labourers. In geography we are continuing to explore North America, in particular the USA. We will be investigating the rise of Silicon valley, California, and how major tech companies have driven mass economic growth in the area.

Science: We have lots of exciting science to investigate this half term. Our science topic is living things and their habitats, so we will be finding out about how we classify animals and explore the vast amount of organisms that we share our beautiful planet with.

Maths: Our maths learning this half term will involve building further on our knowledge of fractions before moving on, in the final week, to investigating measurement.

English: We are continuing to read Cogheart whilst continuing to explore a range of texts for our guided and independent comprehensions. Our writing will include a diary entry from the perspective of a desperate orphan living, in a victorian workhouse, a mystery story about a mysterious disappearance and a narrative based on the Titanium music video, by David Guetta.
