Children need to come to school in their P.E. kits every Monday and Thursday.

Children need to practise their times tables every week, through Times Tables Rockstars. I cannot stress enough how important fluency in these key facts are for the new year 6 maths learning.

Please encourage your child to read at home. Reading for 20 minutes a day exposes children to 1.2 million words over a year, and supports all areas of children's learning.

I will be setting the spelling lists for the children on Sunday mornings and they expire just before school on Fridays. It is an expectation that your children access Spelling Shed at least twice a week, there are lots of fun interactive games for them to be having a go at that will also help boost their writing capabilities.
