

### **Phonics**

We will be continuing our Little Wandle phonics from Phase 5. More information on how to help your child can be found here: For parents – Letters and Sounds (littlewandlelettersandsounds.org.uk). We will be sending home the assessment we carried out at the end of last half term. Please help your child with any of the gaps they have in their learning.

#### Maths

This half term we will be looking at addition and subtraction within 20, place value within 50 and mass and volume. Playing Numbots regularly will support your child with addition, subtraction and place value.

# Handwriting and Letter/Number Formation

Forming letters and numbers correctly is really important in Year One, so that the children become ready for Year 2. We do regular handwriting sessions where we model correct letter formation and consistency of the size and presentation of letters and words. Please support your child by encouraging them to practise at home. Letter and number formation sheets will be handed out at parent's evening but if you would like one before then, please ask a member of staff.

## **Important Reminders**

Please ensure your child's jumpers and cardigans are clearly labelled with their name.



Please send your child with a named water bottle each day so that they can have access to regular drinks.

Your child will read in a group three times a week each so please make sure that your child's reading book is in their bag every day.

## Homework Expectations

#### Reading:

Please support your child by listening to them read regularly. Every day would be amazing and 4 times per week would be our minimum recommendation. Please don't forget to add a brief comment in your child's reading record.
