At Kirk Fenton C of E Primary School, the EYFS curriculum is designed to encourage independent, inquisitive and happy learners. We maximise cross curricular links, put reading at the heart of everything we do and support our children to build strong foundations for their future. Children learn through a balance of child-initiated and adult-directed activities and challenges. The weekly timetable is carefully structured so that children have rigorous directed teaching in English, mathematics, phonics and reading every day.








Children are provided with plenty of time to engage in exploration and play throughout a variety of experiences, which are carefully planned to engage and challenge them in the provision, both inside and outside.

A daily phonics session in the morning
A daily math session in the afternoon
A daily literacy activity
A daily handwriting session
A daily reading practice group
A daily RE worship or discussion
A whole class story
Access to indoor and outdoor provision
Access to snack and milk during freeflow





The whole school uses the Marvellous Me online tool to award children badges to celebrate their learning, values and behaviours.

Teachers also use this app to share messages and reminders with parents, along with photos of the children's learning.

### Speaking to staff



Staff will be available on the door in the morning and at the end of the day should you need to share any important information. You will notice that Reception is different to private nursery in that we do not give individual debriefs each day. Rest assured, we will let you know if there's anything significant to report from your child's day. For longer or more personal conversations, we welcome you to make an appointment. This can be made directly with the class teacher or through the school office.

Parent consultations take place in the autumn and spring term. This is an opportunity to discuss your child's wellbeing and progress. A written end of year report will be sent home at the end of the school year. This summarises and describes your child's attainment against the EYFS learning goals and is a statutory assessment.



Children in the EYFS come to school in their uniform four days per week and in their PE kit one day per week. In September, all children should come to school on their first day in their school uniform. Your class teacher will let you know the class's PE day within the first couple of weeks of term.

Your child should bring a named water bottle in to school with them every day. You are welcome to send in a named bag of spare clothes to be kept in school in case a change of clothes is needed.

- red or black hair accessories (hair bands, clips, bobbles)

- -Red and white gingham summer dress
- -Black shorts

- white crew neck t-shirt (school badge available)
- red hooded sweatshirt (school badge available)

- red winter hat with school badge




## How to find us 2
