### What we are learning

This half term we have a new class novel: Oliver Twist. An English classic, which will teach the children even more about child poverty during the industrial revolution. In Geography we will be exploring the continent of North America, in particular the USA. We will be investigating the rise of Silicon valley, California, and how major tech companies have driven mass economic growth in the area. For our local study this half term, we will discover how Leeds has grown as a city and discover its key physical geographical features.

We have lots of exciting science to investigate this half term. Our science topic is living things and their habitats, so we will be finding out about how we classify animals and explore the vast amount of organisms that we share our beautiful planet with. Our maths learning this half term will involve building further on our knowledge of fractions before moving on, in the final week, to investigating measurement.
