Key Instant Recall Facts


Know number bonds to 5
Read and write numbers 1 - 20 in numerals and words.
Children should be able to say that 5 is made up of 5 and $0 \quad 4$ and $1 \quad 3$ and 2
They should be able to do this for each number up to 5 .

They should be able to answer these questions in any order, including missing number questions e.g. $3+\square=5$ or $4-\square=2$.

Children should be able to write any given number to 20 as numerals and words.
