



# Key Instant Recall Facts

## Year 1 - Autumn 2

Know number bonds to 5

Read and write numbers 1 - 20 in numerals and words.

Children should be able to say that 5 is made up of  
5 and 0      4 and 1      3 and 2

They should be able to do this for each number up to 5.

They should be able to answer these questions in any order, including missing number questions e.g.  $3 + \square = 5$  or  $4 - \square = 2$ .

Children should be able to write any given number to 20 as numerals and words.  
e.g. 15 fifteen

If 2 is one part of 5, what is the other part?

What do you add to 4 to make 5?

I can split the number 5 into ? and ?

- 5 teddies are made of 1 blue teddy and 4 red teddies
- Find different ways of partitioning a number of biscuits or sweets between 2 (or 3) plates. How many on each plate?
- Use practical resources - Your child has one potato on their plate and you give them three more. Can they predict how many they will have now?
- Make 2 'homes' (boxes) for a number of teddies, toys or dolls or 2 car parks for a number of cars.
- Find different ways to partition the dolls/teddies/cars
