Count, read and write numbers to 100 in numerals and read the numbers as words

Children should be able to say that \$2 is made up of fifty (5 tens) and 2 (2 ones). They should be able to write the numeral e.g. \$2 and read the word for each number from 8 to 188.

Key Vocabulary

Children should be able to count (in order) and read from 0 to 100 in numerals and words What comes after number? What comes before number?

Things to try

- Children need to be able to read the words before spelling them.
- Can you spot numbers in the environment? For example, house numbers as you walk down the street or prices when you are in a shop.
- Number treasure hunt. Write numbers in numerals. When children find them peg them on a washing line in order.
 - Write a number and ask the child to shout the name of the number. Then ask them to write which number comes next.
- Give 2 numbers and ask which number is the larger (or smaller) number.
