Count, read and write numbers to 100 in numerals and read the numbers as words

Children should be able to say that $\$ 2$ is made up of fifty ( $\$$ tens) and 2 (2 ones). They should be able to write the numeral e.g. 52 and read the word for each number from $\theta$ to $10 \theta$.

Key Vocabulary
Things to try

- Children need to be able to read the words before spelling them.
Children should be able to count (in order) and read from 0 to 100 in numerals and words
What comes after - Write a number and ask the child to shout the number?
What comes before number? name of the number. Then ask them to write which number comes next.
- Give 2 numbers and ask which number is the larger (or smaller) number.
