What are we Learning:

Our topic this term is: How did the Romans come to invade Britain?

In English, we will be finishing our biography on the life of Mary Anning. We will then be moving onto a narrative about an escape from a natural disaster, based on the events at Pompeii. We will continue with a focus on good handwriting and sentence structure, whilst also looking at conjunctions and tense.



In maths, our focus will be on fractions followed by length and perimeter and then mass and capacity. We will also be continuing with our weekly timestable quiz.



Our science topic will continue looking at Rocks and we will be recognising that soils are made from rocks and organic matter. Additionally, for British Science Week, we will be choosing, investigating and presenting an assembly on who Luther King class thinks is the greatest scientist of all time why!



In History, we will be looking at how the Romans built the Roman Empire, invaded other countries as well as the impact they had on Britain.



What are we Reading?

This term we will be finishing 'Stig of the dump' by Clive King.



We will also be reading 'Stitch Head' by Guy Bass.



We will also be reading a range of picture books and short texts linked to our science, history and writing topics.
