## Know odd and even numbers to 10

Children should be able to recognise that 2,4,6,8 and 10 are even numbers. This means they can be shared into two equal groups.
Children should be able to recognise that 1,3,5,7 and 9 are odd numbers.

## Things to try

Key Vocabulary even odd pair share

- Line up toys or teddies in twos
- Investigate odd numbers by trying to share them into 2 groups fairly
- Look at house numbers on your street, odd are on one side and even numbers on the other.
- If you have a calendar on the wall, you could mark the odd and even numbers on your calendar so children start to understand.
