What we are learning

Our learning this half term is all about innovations and inventions. We are investigating the Industrial Revolution in history, focussing on the inventions that made the revolution possible, the impact the changes in industry had on towns and cities, and the experiences of working children at this time in history. As part of this learning we will also be exploring the work of L.S. Lowry, thinking about what his paintings show us about life in an industrialised city and recreating our own art in the style of Lowry.

Our science topic is Evolution and Inheritance, so we will be finding out about how animals adapt to their environment, who Charles Darwin was and what he discovered about the evolution of species. In maths we will be building on our knowledge of the formal written methods of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division, before moving onto our biggest year 6 maths topic: fractions.

Finally, in English we will be reading *Street Child* by Berlie Doherty and our writing will include a mystery story about a mysterious disappearance, a report on a newly discovered, imagined, new species. and a balanced argument on climate change and climate justice.
