### What we are learning

Our learning this half term turns to exploring the wonderful world we live in and how it has been formed. In history we will be discovering what life was like in Ancient Egypt. We will meet a number of famous pharaohs and explore the life of Howard Carter, the archaeologist who discovered the tomb of Tutankhamun. We have lots of exciting science to investigate this half term. Our science topic is living things and their habitats, so we will be finding out about how we classify animals and explore the vast amount of organisms that we share our beautiful planet with. Our

maths learning this half term will involve new topics including algebra and decimals.

In English we are continuing to explore a range of texts for our guided and independent comprehensions. We will be reading Where the World turns wild by Nicola Penfold; a wonderful story about two young children surviving in a re-wild world after an epidemic. Our writing will include a non-chronological report on keeping healthy and the adverse effects of drugs and alcohol. Linking to our history, we will also produce an instruction text about how to mummify a human just like the Egyptians. Finally in RE we will be exploring racism and how religion can help to reduce it.

In a couple of weeks time we will be embarking on our year 6 residential. It'll be a fantastic experience where the children will develop vital skills.
