





Phonics

This half term we will be reviewing Phase 3.



Week I- Review Phase 3: ai, ee, igh, oa, oo, ar, or, ur, oo, ow, oi and ear

Week 2 – Review Phase 3: er and air and words with double letters longer words

Week 3 - Words with two or more digraphs

Week 4 - Longer words ending with ing and compound words

Week 5 – Longer words with <u>s</u> in the middle, words containing an <u>s</u> or <u>es</u> that make a <u>z</u> sound (e.g. poison sounds like p-oi-<u>z</u>-o-n, foxes sounds like $f-o-x-\underline{z}$).

We will send home phonics homework in your child's red book each week. Please ensure their book is brought to school every Thursday.

Maths



This half term we will be looking at ordering numbers to 8. We will be using the term 'less than.' We will be looking at doubling a number. We will also be sorting numbers according to the<u>ir</u> attributes, such as whether they are odd or even. We will be looking at mass and capacity – we will be using scales to compare items to find out whether they are heavier/ lighter. Finally we will be looking at capacity and finding out which containers hold the most.
