### What are we learning:

In English, we will be retelling a Norse myth, which is linked to our topic on Vikings. This will be based on the book: Arthur and the Golden Rope. This is a beautiful book with lovely illustrations. We will be looking to combine our learning of dialogue, sentence types, fronted adverbials, and expanded noun phrases to create expand and describe these stunning scenes. After this, we will be writing a newspaper report on the Lindisfarne Viking invasion! We will be learning how to structure our writing into a recount, along with eye witness accounts and quotes from experts.


Our big grammar focus this term will be using possessive apostrophes, especially ensuring they are using them correctly when pluralising. (The boys' changing room/the boy's pen) Please see the links and support to learning section at the bottom for extra help with this.

In maths, we are continuing with fractions. We will be looking at improper and mixed number fractions, and then looking at adding and subtracting these fractions. Then we will move onto decimals. In particular, looking at tenths and hundredths.

In science, we are learning about states of matter. This will involve looking at liquid, solid, and gas and how materials change between these states.

In history, we are focussing on the Vikings and how they came to what is now England. We will look at their myths and Gods, how they lived their life, and how their era came to an end.
