What we are learning

This half term, we have moved onto a two week timetable. This move is to ensure that the children are accessing a well rounded curriculum while we continue to support and prepare the children for their SAT's. Our learning this half term will start off with finishing our investigation of the Industrial Revolution and exploring the work of L.S. Lowry in Art before moving onto exploring the continent of North America, in particular the USA. In DT we will be learning all about different types of bridge structures. We will investigate strength and purpose before designing and building our own bridges at the end of the half term. Our science topic is animals including humans, so we will be learning all about the human body, components of blood and how our heart keeps blood moving around our bodies. Our maths learning this half term will involve building further on our knowledge of fractions before moving on, in the final weeks, to investigating measurement.
